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# Senior Pastor Joe Freeman's Annual Report

We Serve A God of Mission: That's How Hearts Are Awakened and Lives Are Transformed!!

As we consider the larger framework of living life with purpose, what is the individual Christian's journey and the local congregation's role, if we are to truly listen to and heed God's voice and call upon our lives?

As it concerns the individual Christian's journey, I couldn't think of a better, more helpful counsel and answer than what Billy Graham once said, many years ago:

*"When we come to Jesus Christ, we bring everything that we have. Our bodies with all their members, our faculties, our talents, our time, our money, our possessions, our hearts, our will, are all His".*

And as we mature in personhood and faith, Christ gains prominence in more arenas of our lives -- and that's what informs and fashions our individual journey. I encourage you, as your pastor, to offer your heart's full surrender to Christ and continue daily, the life transformation journey, through your involvement in Christian Community and your personal practice of spiritual disciplines.

As it concern the purpose and place of Christian Community, we must grow-up/mature as a congregation and see mission less as a program through our church and more as a true hallmark of congregational identity.

To be a person of mission, in Christian community, is to willingly be the hands-and-feet of Christ, serving others in His Name. The fact of the matter is that each and every member of Christ the Savior Church needs to grow in his/her compassion – quotient and serve others in Christ's name. In the opening verses of Mark 2, I'm so struck by the true, more-than-words, actions of four men, who cared so much for a paralyzed, very needy man, that they went well beyond decorum and put a hole in the roof of a home, just so the handicapped man could be closer to the means by which his life would be practically helped. Read it and see the beauty and courage of uncommon initiative by otherwise, very common guys.

*What must we learn, and unlearn, to be agents of God's mission in the world?* We need to think less programmatically and compartmentally and more experientially and together as Christian community, to serve in such critically important ways. People in this world need a true taste of the real Christ. Genuine, compassionate service in Christ's name, through vessels like you and me, awakens and motivates people to discard mis-notions of God for true, apt representations of Him. Let's get back to the root of what it means to be a church, to be in the world, doing God's work. Explore and participate with fellow folk at Christ the Savior Church and be part of what we're called to be and do, individually and together: "Awakening hearts...and transforming lives".

Before I close, I need to mention our congregation's continued discernment journey, begun in 2009 and continuing through most this current year of 2010, regarding the ELCA's decision on blessing same sex unions and ordaining gays in committed relationships. This process has called all of us to learn to practice both love and truth, as well as to practice compassion and to continue growing in our understanding of one another. Our leadership and membership will "land" with a decision in the not-too-distant future, on whether to remain within the ELCA or to become a part of another Lutheran denomination. Your continued prayers, patience, participation, partnership and perseverance are very, very much valued, welcomed and appreciated.

To conclude, I'm excited about both the individual Christian's journey and the local congregation's role, in doing our part to fulfill the mission of God in the world: to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with others; and to be the hands and feet of Christ, in compassionate service to others, in his name; that is, to redeem lives and to serve lives where people hurt. Let's do nothing short of that, individually and together.

# Pastor of Ministry and Maturity Libby Manning's Annual Report

Hebrews 5:11—About this we have much to say that is hard to explain, since you have become dull in understanding. For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you again the basic elements of the oracles of God. You need milk, not solid food; for everyone who lives on milk, being still an infant, is unskilled in the word of righteousness. But solid food is for the mature, for those whose faculties have been trained by practice to distinguish good from evil.

**Maturity Steeple** Thank you to Karl Freburg who is the lay leader for the Maturity Steeple this year. Spiritual growth what the maturity steeple is all about, and spiritual growth is defined as an increasing love for God and for other people. The church exists so that you may grow spiritually and grow closer to Christ. However, every church has limited time and resources, so the maturity steeple leaders try to identify the highest impact catalysts for spiritual growth, and focus our time and attention on those catalysts. The Reveal Spiritual Life Survey helps us in our task of determining these catalysts for spiritual growth, so we appreciate the participation of the congregation when it is time to take the surveys.

Church activities provide an important “on ramp” for the development of spiritual beliefs, but if that is all Christ the Savior offers, we are not deepening our people spiritually. So the most dominant force driving spiritual engagement is a routine of practice of spiritual disciplines, which shifts faith from passive to active, and allows people to take on more responsibility for their spiritual growth. It is important to remember that spiritual growth is not about increasing activities; it is about growing an increasingly intimate relationship with Christ. After the development of spiritual practices, the most important catalyst for growth is service, and giving away your life. The maturity steeple is thus partnering with the mission steeple to offer more ways to volunteer and serve God's people. All of our classes and course offerings are contained within a booklet entitled, “Pathways to Spiritual Growth” so that people can be aware of the many offering available to them at Christ the Savior.

**Ministry Steeple** Thank you to Dena Wenger who is the lay leader for the Ministry Steeple. It is a great privilege for me to serve along side this group of people who are dedicated to and gifted for the ministry of card-writing, meal-making, hospital visitation, funeral meal preparation, new-mom meals, and prayer-gatherings and classes. This year we are giving emphasis to improving our new member integration procedures, so that new members can more quickly get connected and integrated into Christian community and spiritual growth at Christ the Savior.

On a personal note, I very much appreciated the opportunity to attend the Festival of Homiletics preaching conference in Nashville, TN this year, and look forward to participating in the Wabash Pastoral Leadership Program, which gathers 18 young pastors from across the state of Indiana for pastoral leadership training and travel, over the course of the next two years.

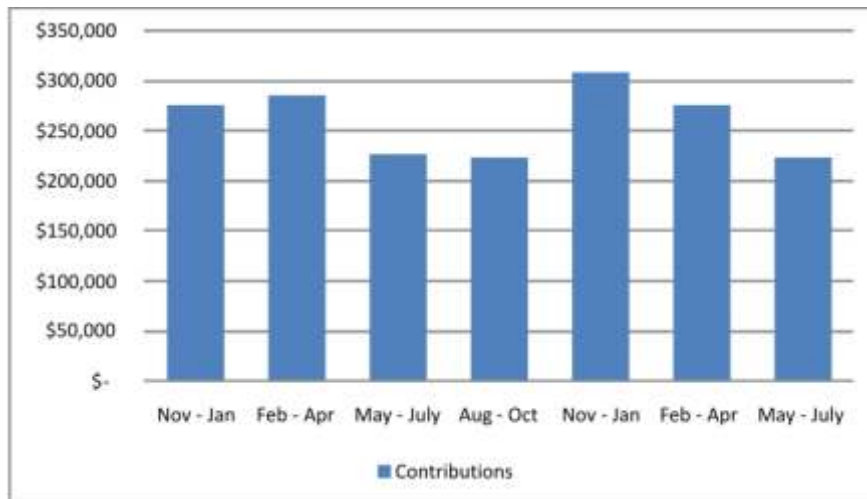

# Treasurers Report

### Contributions and Expenses

The 2008-2009 year continued to be a difficult time for the economy and our church. But we were able to adjust and end the year with a small excess due to high interest bearing CD's maturing. Our actual contributions were below budget by \$33,424 or 3%, and only slightly above the prior year by \$7,116 (less than 1 %). See graph below for quarterly trend in contributions:



To adjust for the shortfall in contributions, our staff reviewed all spending planned for the year and reduced those areas where it was most appropriate. As a result of their effort, we were able to reduce our expenses by \$63,112 or 6% compared to plan. The majority of these cost reductions were the result of lower interest expense on our debt (\$16,000), cost containment reductions (\$14,000) and timing of headcount additions (\$33,000). Interest income was \$26,000 for the fiscal year due to high interest CD's maturing at a 5% interest rate. These CD's were rolled over during the current year, but at lower interest rates (2%) due to the slower economy. Interest earned on CDs (approximately \$24,000) was rolled back into our set-aside accounts by the end of the fiscal year. The new SCRIP program was also able to generate \$4,200 for the church at the end of our fiscal year.

However, due to lower than expected contribution levels, we were not able to provide any additional funding to our ministries. It is important to note that an accounting method change was made this fiscal year, from a Cash to Modified Accrual basis.

### Balance Sheet

Consistent with prior years, our church continues to maintain a strong cash reserve to manage in case of emergencies and timing of our cash flow based upon contributions. As of 7/31/2009, we had \$583,000 in cash, of which \$550,000 was invested in CD's or money market funds. These cash reserves are used to support our dedicated accounts, set-asides and unplanned expenses.

We were able to reduce our mortgage by \$143,000 during the year with the ending balance to be \$1,571,000 as of 7/31/2009. As of the end of our fiscal year, the interest rate on the fixed mortgage was 5.875% and the variable rate mortgage was at 2.53%. Both mortgages mature in May, 2011 and we continue to review the various options available to the church concerning refinancing.
